It seemed that our characters hadn't aged in no time - but they still remained true to themselves, especially to Rosie. Perhaps the most I liked this book was the fact that it was not told like your ordinary novel; plot unfolded through countless letters, emails, postcards and instant messages, each reveals something new. This added a unique element to the book and took place gently and skillfully, which clearly shows the hard work and talent of the author. The book was very successful and so, a decade later, adaptation Love, Rosie dated the late Lily Collins and Sam Kleflin. The basic premise of both stories is that of two best friends who secretly have something for each other, and just never get together because life continues to get in the way. The book and film explore how easy it is for two people to miss out if they don't make the right choice, if they're not brave enough to chase what they want. Both of our characters make stupid decisions and bad choices, especially in the book, but they are always part of the lives of others, they are just never in the right place. Rosie and Alex met when they were young children and immediately became best friends. At first, things are very innocent, but they're inseparable. Over time, they also begin to face more teenage problems, such as crushing people from school and the fact that people often mistake them for a couple. It's not nice to see your friendship from the beginning and follow it through the years. In the book, Alex moves to Boston with his family in his teens, leaving Rosie in Dublin. In the film, Alex doesn't move to America until he's accepted to Harvard. In both, Alex and Rosie plan for Rosie to come to Boston and start their adult lives together. There seems to be something implicitly understood between them that when they return to the same country, they would like to see where things happen. Unfortunately, Rosie never gets there, because at her official school, she ends up getting pregnant, and the life they planned together immediately disappears when their future is divergent. Rosie began building a life for her and her daughter Katie after Alex began to start a medical career in America and met a woman named Sally, who she married. While in the book, Alex and Sally seem like a relatively happy couple with a real chance, in the film Sally is portrayed as some kind of married, pretentious bitch. I didn't want Sally to be the bad guy on the story, since that wasn't supposed to be the focus. It was supposed to be that she wasn't right for Alex, as pretty as she looked, just because he's in love with someone else. The book sees Rosie marry a man named Greg, while in the film Greg is Katie's father and the boy Rosie was in love with at school. In both, Greg turns out to be the wrong person for Rosie, don't treat her the way she deserves to be treated and cheated on. Greg can see Rosie and Alex are very close and is very jealous of their affection for each other as well as their story, and goes so far as to viciously steal a very tender letter Alex sends Rosie expressing her feelings for her. Because she never sees him, she doesn't keep her promise to make her happy if she just gives him a chance, and so he his feelings aside because she thinks she chose Greg. It's very sad to see someone Rosie trusts and cares about deliberately stopping her from being happy, but that's something a lot of people can relate to. I read Where the Rainbow Ends years ago, and I liked it. I never thought it would be a movie. Part of me never wanted it to be a movie because I knew that the story of love between Rosie and Alex, which is depicted in the book, wouldn't turn well into a movie. The time to perform the film simply does not allow it; in the film they have only managed to show 12 years of friendship, while in the book we cover 45 years. The screenwriter of the film would never have been able to describe the things that were in the book, and I made up with it when I decided to watch the film last year, mostly. What I couldn't reconcile with was the love between Rosie and Alex being reduced to the idea that boys and girls can't just be friends. Especially with the label line for one of the posters I saw that I read it's never too late to fall in love with a friend. That line framed me to make it clear that the movie wasn't in place. The book is about soul mates, about fate collecting two people no matter what. I'll give the screenwriter points for experience. Where Rainbows End has always been difficult to translate into another medium, because the book is only letters and emails and messages. So I appreciate the effort. Plus the casting of Collins and Cilfin was excellent, and the chemistry between them was fascinating, so again well done. I really enjoyed the movie, despite how I made it sound up to that point. It was fun and romantic. There were moments when I laughed, moments when I knew exactly how the characters felt, moments when I was almost thrown to tears. In itself, it was a beautiful movie, just not like the book. When Rainbow end made me realize that I didn't need to know exactly what my next step in life was, because the chances weren't that it would work out that way. It made me judge what I thought of him growing up and finding your soulmate that making mistakes along the way was fine until I gave up following my heart. Love, Rosie didn't give me the same feeling, unfortunately. It's a pity Rosie and Alex didn't get any older, as it would have given the story a little more substantial to remember how long it had been while they were spinning each other, and they were both afraid.
